

## VERBS WITH INFINITIVES

**Tener + que+ infinitive** -to have to

- Must use a form of the verb tener

<b>Tener</b>	<b>To have</b>
<b>Tengo</b>	<b>Tenemos</b>
<b>Tienes</b>	<b>Tenéis</b>
<b>Tiene</b>	<b>Tienen</b>

EXAMPLES:

1. I have to study. - **Yo tengo que estudiar.**
2. She has to wear a uniform. - **Ella tiene que llevar un uniforme.**
3. We don't have to watch T.V.-**Nosotros no tenemos que mirar la televisión.**

**Ir + a+ infinitive-** To be going to or will do something

- Must use a form of the verb Ir

<b>Ir</b>	<b>To go</b>
<b>Voy</b>	<b>Vamos</b>
<b>Vas</b>	<b>Vais</b>
<b>Va</b>	<b>Van</b>

EXAMPLES:

1. I am going to dance. - **Yo voy a bailar.**
2. They will talk on the phone. -**Ellos van a hablar por teléfono.**
3. She is not going to study. -**Ella no va a estudiar.**

**Acabar + de + infinitive** -To have just (done something) \*\*\*used when saying what just happened

- Must have a form of Acabar

<b>Acabar</b>	<b>To just</b>
<b>Acabo</b>	<b>Acabamos</b>
<b>Acabas</b>	<b>Acabáis</b>
<b>Acaba</b>	<b>Acaban</b>

EXAMPLES:

1. I just have to study. - **Yo acabo de estudiar.**
2. She just watched her favorite program- **Ella acaba de mirar el programa favorito.**
3. We just took a test. - **Nosotros acabamos de tomar el examen.**
